

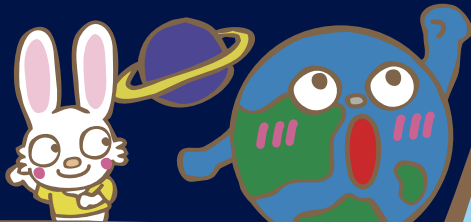
Gring and Woodin's Grand Project for Saving the Future 2

Animals look very happy!

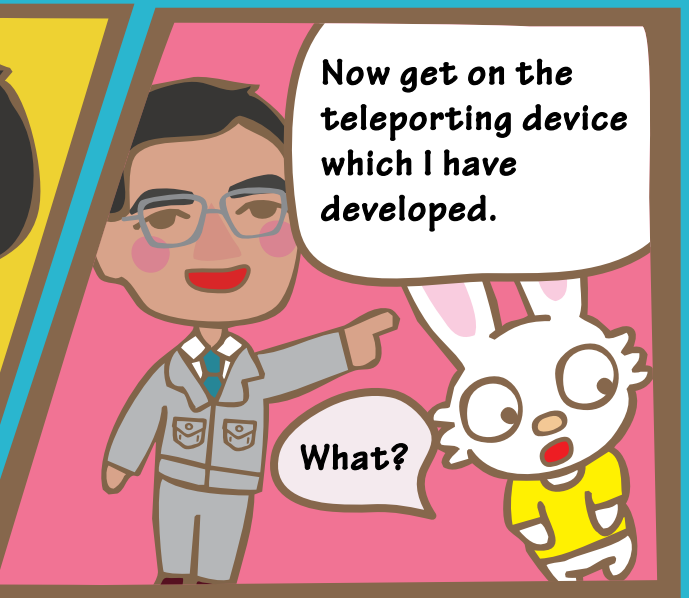
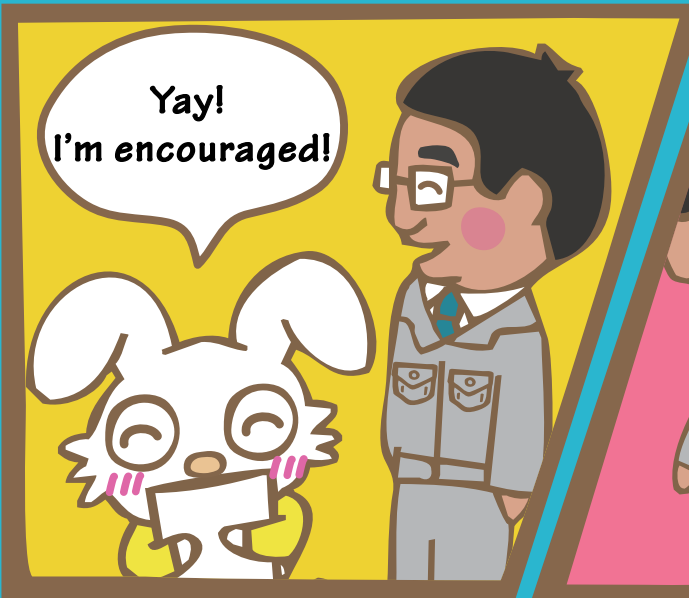
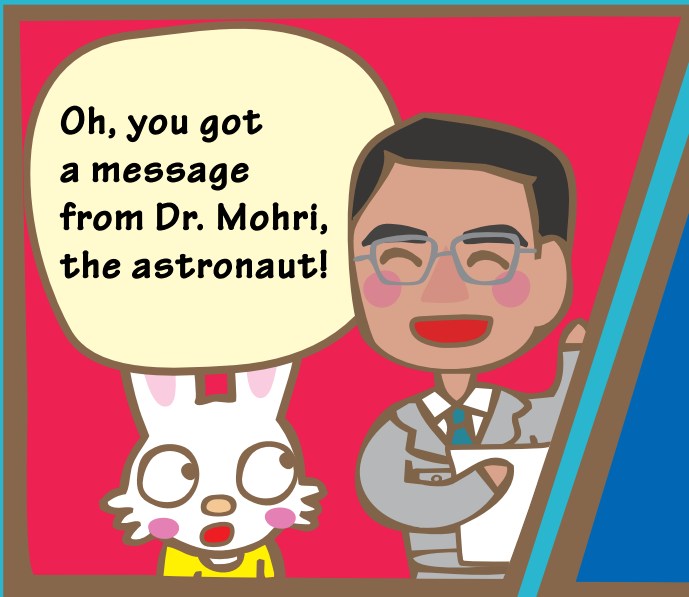

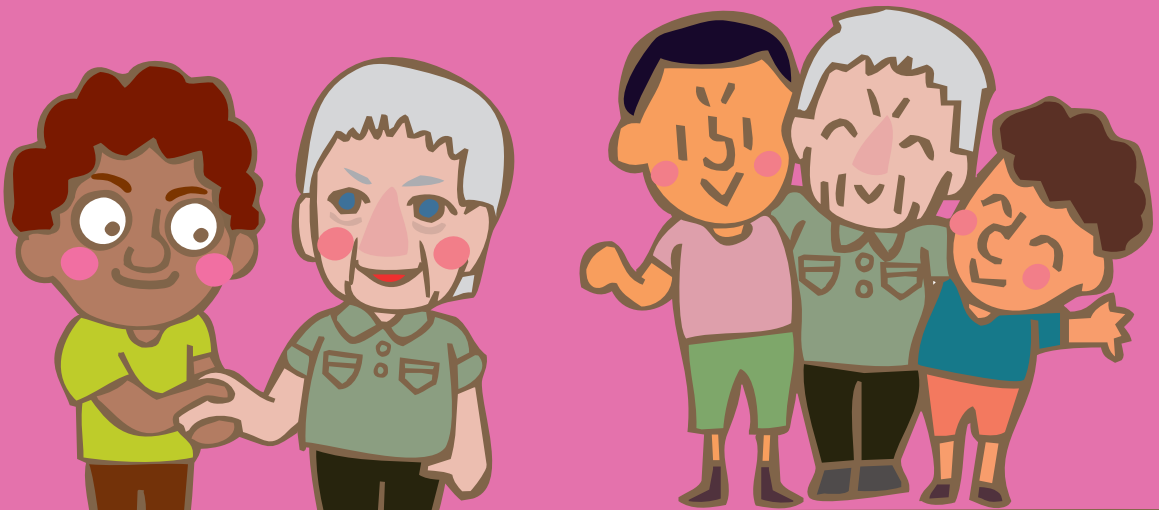
What do we need to

Let's protect together!!

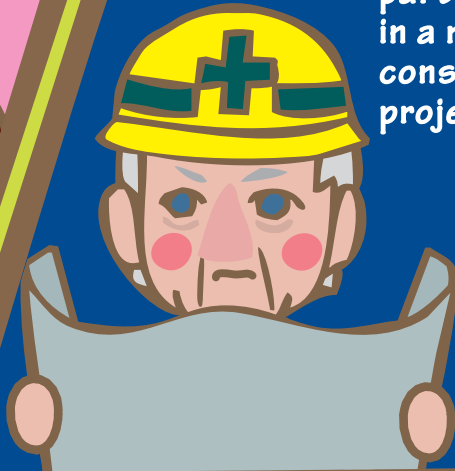


Because we have conserved those animals, many people from around the world came to visit the park to see them.

In the beginning, the road was planned to be built across the park.



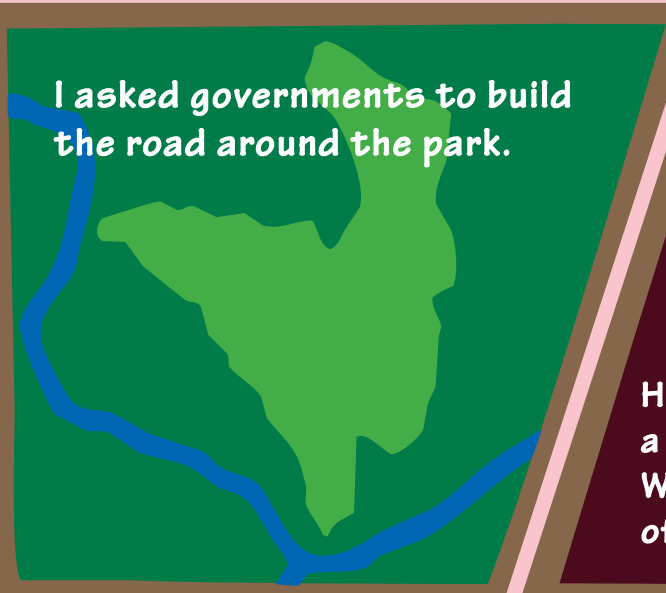
Every season, animals migrate within the park on a large scale for food and water.



If there is a road within a park, that would prevent animals from migrating freely.



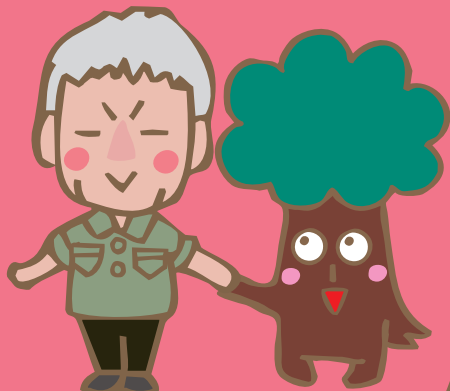
I asked governments to build the road around the park.



Humans are a part of nature. We may be the cause of the destruction of nature.



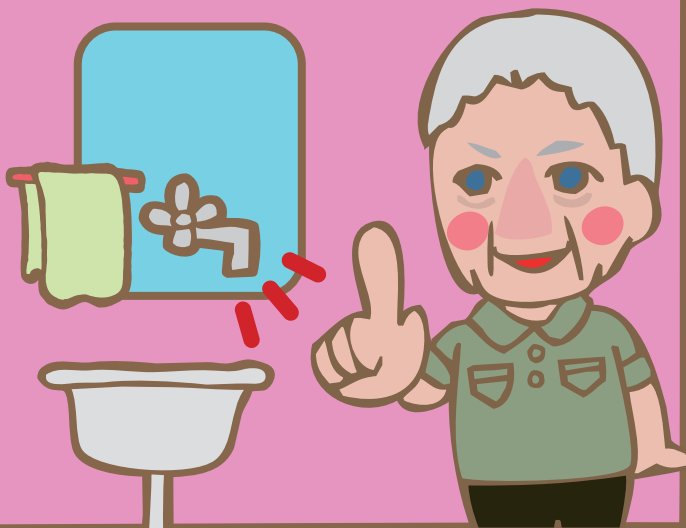
But we can live while protecting it

For example ... stop leaving the water running while you brush your teeth! That is something you can do to protect nature.



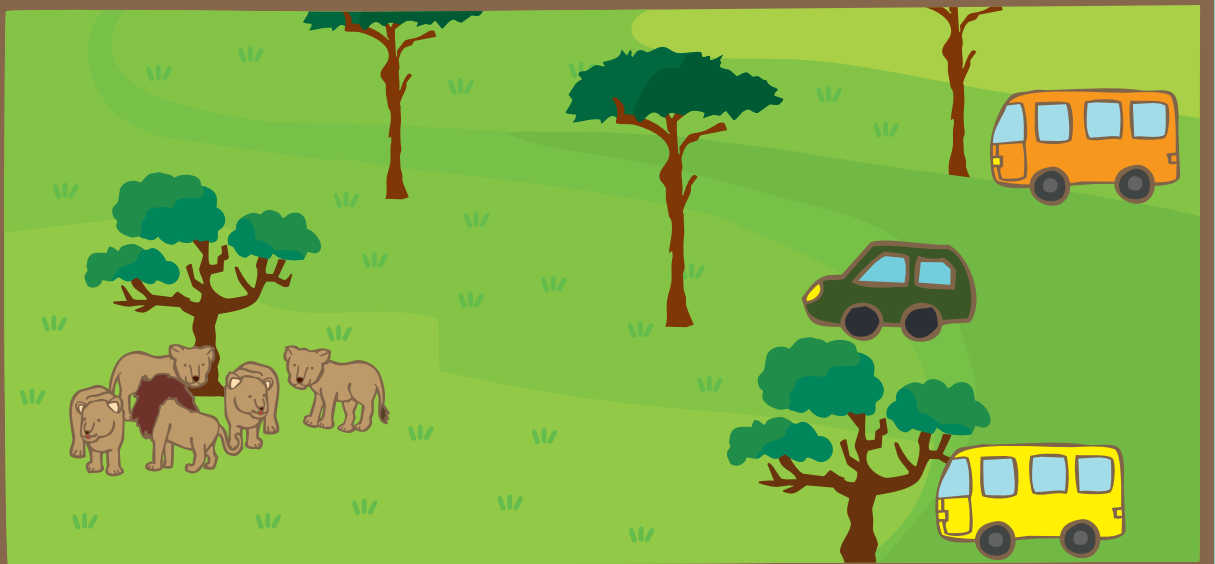
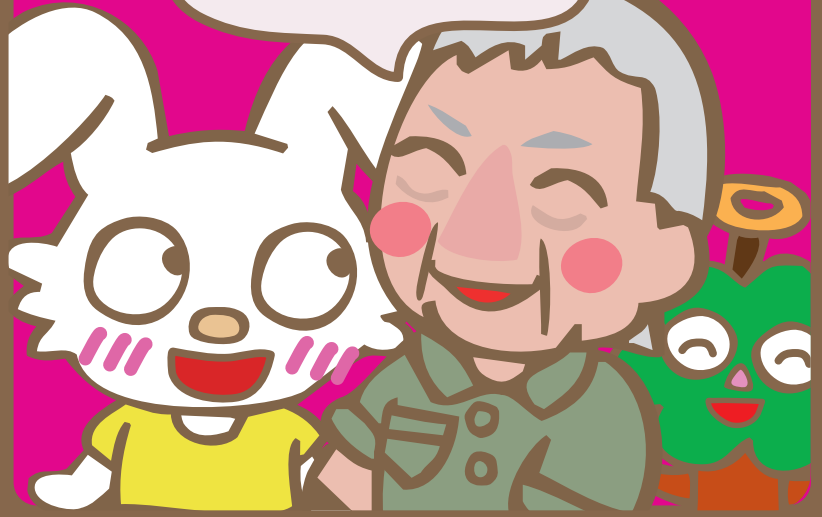
Let's do this together!



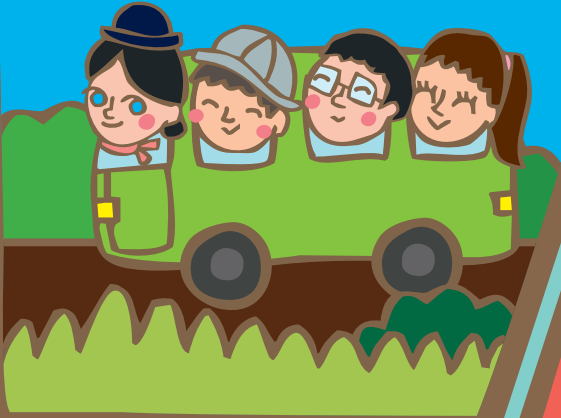
Now I'm going to patrol the park, so come with me!



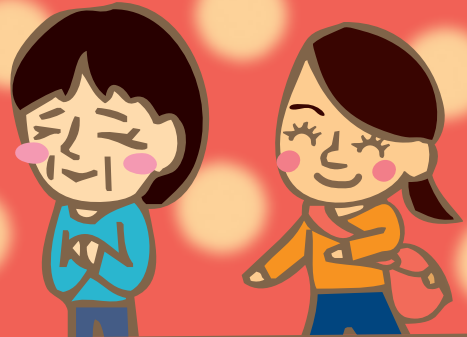

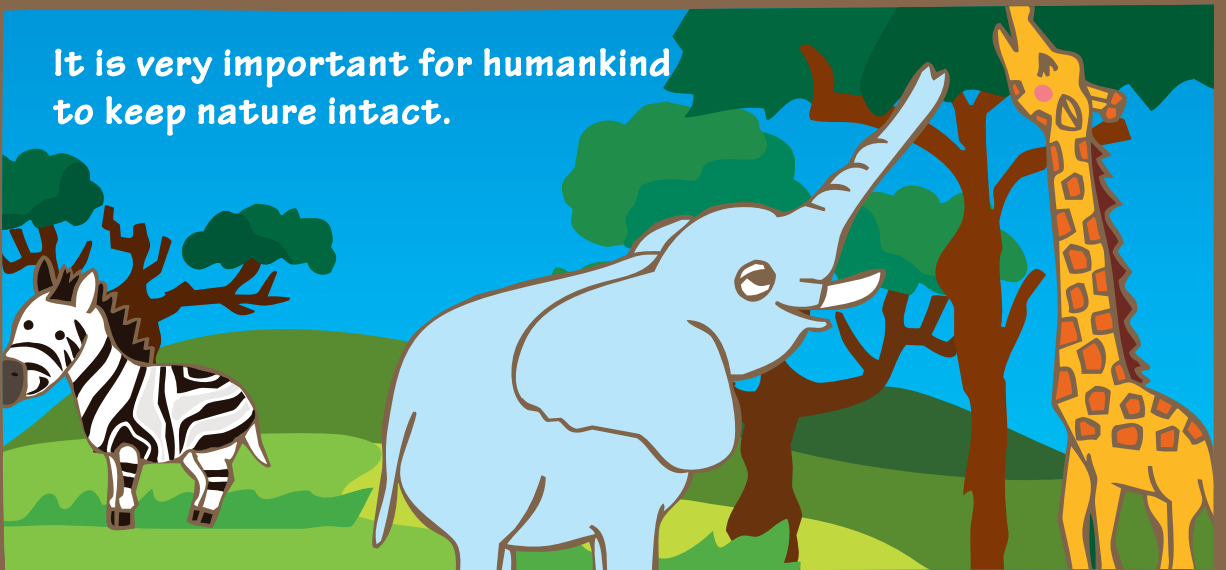
Now there is a very popular guided tour in this park.



Even if the people come here for the first time, they feel like coming home.



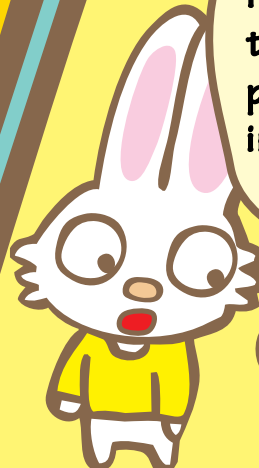
It is very important for humankind to keep nature intact.

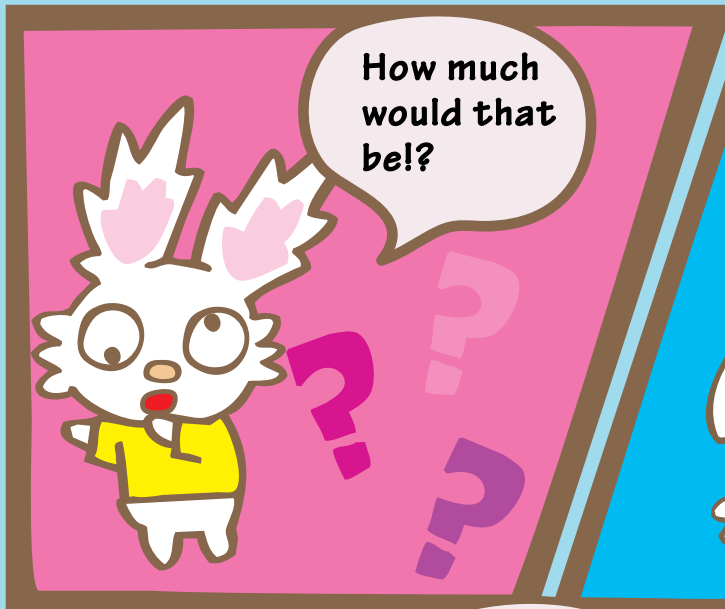

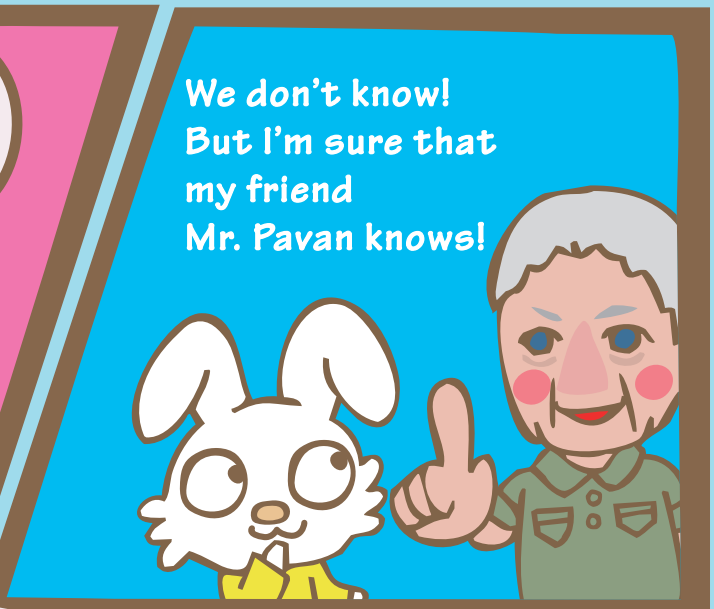


How much of the nature's gift provide us in terms of money?

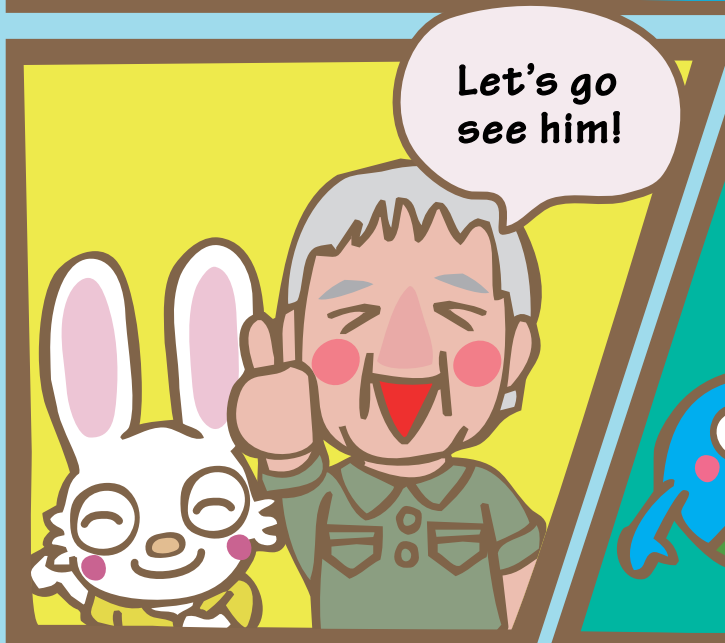
